

What is the AGC Mentor program?

The New AGC Mentor program is designed to expose both high school and higher education students to the world of architecture, construction, engineering (A-C-E) and the building trades by pairing them with industry professionals.

In this afterschool mentoring program, students connect directly with professionals from the A-C-E industry to assist in developing skills and knowledge that will enhance the less-experienced person's professional and personal growth.

For students, it is a chance to discover and develop your skills, set goals and get on track towards exciting and rewarding careers. In addition, students have the opportunity to form positive relationships with industry professionals who may provide important references for obtaining scholarships, internships and full-time employment.

For professionals, the AGC Mentor program provides an opportunity to give back to the community while developing the next generation in the commercial construction industry and networking with other professionals who share the same passions.

How does it work?

The program runs for THREE MONTHS and meets at a convenient location for the Mentee.

- Students will meet their mentors when they attend the initial orientation.

It is through that communication that mentors will be able to recognize, understand and help to meet the needs of their mentee.
